PETER SINN NACHTRIEB (PLAYWRIGHT), 6'6", is a San Francisco-based playwright and is Playwright in Residence at Z Space. His other works include A House Tour of the Infamous Porter Family Mansion with Tour Guide Weston Ludlow Londonderry (Z Space 2016), The Totalitarians (NNPN premiere 2014), boom (TCG's most produced play 2009-10), BOB, (2011 Humana Festival for New American Plays at Actor's Theatre of Louisville, Barrie and Bernice Stavis Award), T.I.C. (Trenchcoat In Common), Hunter Gatherers (2007 ATCA/Steinberg New Play Award, 2007 Will Glickman Prize), Colorado, and Litter: The True Story of the Framingham Dodecutuplets. His work has been seen off-Broadway and worldwide including at Ars

Nova, Woolly Mammoth, SPF, Seattle Repertory, Actors Theatre of Louisville, Southern Rep, Kitchen Dog, and in the Bay Area at Z Space, A.C.T., Encore Theatre, Killing My Lobster, Marin Theatre Company, Impact Theatre, and The Bay Area Playwrights Festival. Projects in process include an original musical called Fall Springs (NAMT festival 2017) with composer/lyricist Niko Tsakalakos. Peter holds a degree in Theater and Biology from Brown and an MFA in Creative Writing from San Francisco State University. Peter is a recent alum of New Dramatists. (San Francisco), Milwaukee Rep, Old Globe, Geffen (L.A.) Actors Theatre of Louisville, Portland Center Stage, Geva Theatre, Playmakers Rep, Cleveland Play House, Alliance Theatre, California Shakespeare, Dad's Garage Theatre Company, City Theatre, Swine Palace, Neo-Futurists, Aurora Theatre, Crowded Fire and the Edinburgh Festival Fringe. He is the Artistic Director of Merrimack

Repertory Theatre. He's previously served as the Artist-At-Large for Geva Theatre Center and spent four years at the Tony Award-winning Actors Theatre of Louisville as the theatre's Associate Artistic Director (where he directed 17 productions including five Humana Festivals). Mr. Daniels is the former Associate Artistic Director/Resident Director of the California Shakespeare Theater and before that spent a decade as the Artistic Director and Co-Founder of Dad's Garage Theatre Company in Atlanta. DANNY SCHEIE previously appeared at Z Space in the world premiere of Peter Nachtrieb's A House Tour...as Weston Ludlow Londonderry. He first acted opposite Aysan Celik in the world premiere of Nachtrieb's Bob at Actors Theater of Louisville's Humana Festival of New American Plays and then in the world premiere of this play at Merrimack Rep in Massachusetts, both directed by Sean Daniels. He has thrice received the Bay Area Critics Circle Award for Leading Actor, twice for Supporting Actor, and once for directing The Comedy of Errors as well as multiple LA Dramalogues, the New Jersey Tony and Helen Hayes (DC), Ovation, Garland and Robbie (LA) nominations. He received the first Theater Bay Area leading actor award playing

both Dromios in *Comedy of Errors* at California Shakespeare Theater. He just completed playing the title role in Amy Freed's *The Monster Builder* at South Coast Rep where he will return next season in her *Shrew!* following an appearance in the title role of Daniel Handler's *Story of the Ghost of the Dead Rabbit* this fall at its Berkeley Rep world premiere. He holds a doctorate from Cal and a professorship at UC Santa Cruz. With V.C.B.T.C. she has collaborated with director Polly Kensington on several works, including Where The Wolves Went, Falling Timber, and Louise and Clara: A feminist retelling. You, the spectator are the reason that she has left her family, her friends, her home. She does this willingly, in the hopes that her performance will perhaps be the catalyst in giving you, the spectator, a fuller life, a more meaningful life, that is powerful and boundless. It would really thrill her if that happened...Please let her know if it did.

Great Moments in Human Achievement marks TERRY DEAN'S four hundred and seventh production he has been in and also represents his acting debut in the lower North Americas.

The accidental result of heavy drug use at a farmer's market, Terry Dean was born into a harsh and treacherous set of circumstances. Fortune, however, diverted his seemingly inevitable journey towards a life selling his body for cigarettes and soda and led him instead to a life in the theater, when he was discovered at the age of nine in a public park by the renowned Ontario director Argus Haversham, who instantly offered him a role in his acclaimed and controversial production of Caligula, Untold. As part of a subsequent legal settlement, Dean became the youngest person to be accepted into the Royal Academy of Canadian Dramatic Arts, earning several degrees, certificates, special stamps and has since performed acts all over Canada, non stop, including on the television in numerous non-recurring roles.

Terry has enjoyed his career so far. He believes himself to be a success, despite what could objectively be described as a trajectory of achievement that seems to be lowering and lowering and lowering with every passing year. Survival is success in his book.

This is his first play he has ever toured by bicycle.



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




THE BROTHER (S) SEP 11 - OCT 21, 2018
