SAN FRANCISCO, CA—November 29, 2017—Z Space and piece by piece productions are pleased to present the world premiere of The Kilbanes' *Weightless*, at Z Space February 22-March 18, 2018. Press opening is Wednesday, February 28 at 8pm.

Commissioned and developed by Z Space, piece by piece Productions and Encore Theatre, five years in the making, *Weightless* is a genre-bending theatrical event that combines intimate storytelling with a high-energy rock show. It is also the first major production of Z Space's 25th Anniversary year.

Weightless is an interpretation of the story of Procne and Philomela, from Ovid's Metamorphoses. Through intimate storytelling and the Kilbanes' celebrated indie rock sound, Weightless explores the bonds of sisterhood and the power of the female voice. The Kilbanes have created a performance style that blends the raucous energy of a rock show with the imaginative spirit of raw, experimental theatre. With Weightless, The Kilbanes weave together poetic fairytale with captivating indie rock to create an electrifying theatrical event.

Directed by Becca Wolff, *Weightless* stars Lila Blue, Julia Brothers, Dan Harris, Kate Kilbane, Dan Moses and Joshua Pollock. For this unique offering, The Kilbanes are curating a program of local bands and musicians who will perform prior to *Weightless* each evening. Guests who come early will be treated to some of the Bay Area's best music, to be followed by the modernized myth of *Weightless*.

Weightless is one of many productions presented with Z Space's longstanding partner, piece by piece productions. Together Z Space and piece by piece also co-produced The Bengsons' *Hundred Days*; and co-presented The Wooster Group's *Early Shaker Spirituals* and *The Town Hall Affair*; and Noche Flamenca/Soledad Barrio's *Antigona*.

About The Kilbanes

The Kilbanes are a captivating voice in the Bay Area music and theater scenes. This Oakland-based, theatrical rock band is the musical experiment of Kate Kilbane and Dan Moses, a songwriting duo (who happen to be married). The Kilbanes have created a performance style that blends the raucous energy of a rock show with the mesmerizing storytelling found in raw, experimental theater.

The Kilbanes' third rock opera, *Eddie the Marvelous Who Will Save the World*, began its life at Berkeley Rep's Ground Floor Program in 2014 and was selected for Theatreworks' New Works Festival in August of 2016. The Kilbanes just returned to Theatreworks for their Writers Retreat, where they began a collaboration with New York-based playwright Lynn Rosen on a new musical, *Gurley!*, about Helen Gurley Brown.

The *SF Chronicle* named a 2016 concert-version of The Kilbanes' rock opera, *Weightless*, as one of the "Top Ten Theater Picks of 2016". An early iteration of *Weightless* won "Best of Fringe" at the SF Fringe Festival in 2012. SF Weekly called it "One of the best shows of the year" and named Kate one of the Bay area's 11 Theater Artists to watch in 2013. The SF Chronicle described *Weightless* as "an outright revelation".

Their first rock opera, *the medea cycle*, has played all over the Bay Area, as well as in Los Angeles, New York, and Dallas. SF music critic Alan Monasch called *the medea cycle* "A masterwork of theater," and SF music blogger Bill Chapin named the song "Chariot Rise" as one of his top 30 tracks of 2012. The

Kilbanes have also collaborated with award-winning Bay Area playwright Lauren Gunderson, composing music for her plays *Ada and the Engine* and *By and By*.

In addition to their work in the theater, The Kilbanes tour as a rock band and have performed at clubs and arthouses in over 20 cities across the United States including: Ars Nova and Littlefield in New York City, Room 5 in Los Angeles, The Red Poppy Art House, Lost Church and Viracocha in San Francisco, The Dragon's Den in New Orleans, as well as venues in Portland, Philadelphia, Cleveland, Chicago, Boulder, Omaha, Salt Lake City, Memphis, and Nashville.

About Z Space

Z Space, based in the Mission District of San Francisco, is one of the nation's leading laboratories for the development of new works. Led by Executive Artistic Director Lisa Steindler since 2007 and founded by David Dower in 1993, Z Space celebrates its 25th anniversary in 2018, continuing its mission to empower artistic risk, collaboration and camaraderie amongst artists and audience in the service of commissioning, developing, and producing new work.

Keystone initiatives include New Work, a development, production, and presentation program that supports artists and ensembles from conception to realization of unique works; Word for Word, a resident theater company that transforms works of literature verbatim to the stage; Youth Arts, an arts education program promoting literacy and creativity; and the subsidized rental program which opens our venues for use by a variety of other art groups.

Z Space fills an essential role in the Bay Area's arts ecology and continues to raise its profile and partnerships both regionally and nationally. Eschewing traditional theater models with fixed seasons and subscription packages, Z Space chooses to remain flexible, to focus on artists' needs, and to facilitate the time and resources necessary to develop each project fully.
